Part II : Instructions to Bidders

1. BIDDING PROCEDURE

A. General

1.1 Scope of Proposal

- 1.1.1 State Project Office Samagra Shiksha Uttarakhand (hereinafter referred to as “SSU”) invites detailed proposals (Key Submissions, Technical Proposal and Financial Proposals) from Bidders for **Implementation of Vocational Education Programme in Government Secondary Schools Uttarakhand** (hereinafter referred as “The Project”).
- 1.1.2 "SSU" has implemented various projects at secondary and senior secondary school level under the umbrella of Samagra Shiksha Scheme, to provide quality education to the students.
- 1.1.3 "SSU" is now implementing Vocational Education Programme in Government Secondary Schools for students of class IX to XII. across the state in selected schools.
- 1.1.4 The programme is designed to run a span of 4 years. Presently, 331 schools of plain and hilly terrain of 13 districts are proposed to cover through this project and wherein students studying in class IXth to XIIth in these schools shall be the beneficiaries. The number of schools may vary (increase or decrease) if required.
- 1.1.5 The Proposals would be evaluated on the basis of the evaluation criteria set out in this RFP Document, to be submitted on e-platform of the proposal shall be evaluated only such documents downloaded by the committee (“Evaluation Methodology”) in order to identify the successful Bidder for the Project (“Successful Bidder”). The Successful Bidder would then have to enter into a Service Agreement with "SSU" and perform the obligations as stipulated therein, in respect of the Project.
- 1.1.6 Terms used in this RFP Document which have not been defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed thereto in the Draft Service Agreement.
- 1.1.7 Projected 331 schools are divided into two categories “Hill”& “Plain”. There are 81 schools in plain area and 250 schools in hill area.

The Vocational Education Programme comprises of following seven sectors/trades:

The Bidders shall submit Technical & Financial Proposals for all trade.

1.2 Eligible Bidders

- 1.2.1 Bidders who qualify as per the technical and financial qualification norms shall be eligible to bid for this project.
- 1.2.2 Consortium is not allowed.
- 1.2.3 Bidders shall acknowledge receipt of this RFP Document and notify their intention to bid for the Project in the format provided as Appendix 1.
- 1.2.4 Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility to the satisfaction of "SSU", as the "SSU" may reasonably request.

1.3 Number of Proposals

- 1.3.1 Each Bidder shall submit only one (1) Proposal for the Project in response to this RFP Document. Submission of more than one proposal for the same Project shall be subject to disqualification.

1.4 Proposal Preparation Cost

- 1.4.1 The Bidder shall be responsible for all the costs associated with the preparation of its Proposal and its participation in the bidding process. "SSU" will not be responsible or in any way liable for such costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of bidding.

1.5 Contents of RFP Document

- 1.5.1 The RFP Document consists of 3 Parts as listed below and would include any addenda issued in accordance with Clause 1.7.

1.6 Clarifications

- 1.6.1 Bidders requiring any clarification on the RFP Document may notify "SSU" in writing or by facsimile within such date as specified in the Schedule of Bidding Process. Based on its sole discretion, "SSU" may or may not forward to all Bidders, copies of "SSU" response, including a description of the enquiry but without identifying its source.

1.7 Amendment of RFP Document

- 1.7.1 At any time prior to the Proposal Due Date, "SSU" may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to clarifications requested by a Bidder, modify the RFP Document by the issuance of Addenda.
- 1.7.2 Any Addendum thus issued will be in writing and uploaded on website **uktenders.gov.in** and it will be Bidder's responsibility to visit website to be updated regarding the changes in RFP document. Individual Bidder shall not be informed, if any changes are made in RFP document and any claim in this regard will not be entertained by "SSU".
- 1.7.3 In order to afford Bidders reasonable time in which to take an Addendum into account, or for any other reason, "SSU" may, at its own discretion, extend the Proposal Due Date.

B. Preparation and Submission of Proposal

1.8 Language and Currency

- 1.8.1 The Proposal and all related correspondence and documents shall be written in the English language. Supporting documents and printed literature furnished by the Bidder with the Proposal may be in any other language provided that they are accompanied by an appropriate translation into English. Supporting materials that are not translated into English may not be considered. For the purpose of interpretation and evaluation of the Proposal, the English language translation shall prevail.

- 1.8.2 The currency of the proposal shall be the Indian Rupee (INR).

1.9

Bid Security

- 1.9.1 As per Financial Management & Procurement manual of Samagra Shiksha page 63 point 7.17.8, Proposals would need to be accompanied by a Bid Security in the form of a demand draft/bank guarantee from Nationalized or Schedule Bank, as per Appendix 4.

- 1.9.2 The Bid Security should be valid up to at least 45 days beyond the validity period of tender and would be required to be extended if so required by "SSU".
- 1.9.3 The Bid Security shall be returned to unsuccessful Bidders within a period of thirty (30) days from the date of announcement of the Successful Bidder. The Bid Security submitted by the Successful Bidder shall be released upon furnishing of the Performance Security in the form and manner stipulated in the Draft Service Agreement.
- 1.9.4 The Bid Security shall be forfeited in the following cases:

If the Bidder withdraws its Proposal except as provided in Clause 1.18 ;

- (a) If the Bidder withdraws its Proposal during the interval between the Proposal Due Date and expiration of the Proposal Validity Period; and
- (b) If the Successful Bidder fails to provide the Performance Security within the stipulated time or any extension thereof provided by "SSU".

1.10 Validity of Proposal

- 1.10.1 The Proposal shall be valid for a period of 180 days from the opening of technical bid opening date. "SSU" reserves the right to reject any Proposal that does not meet this requirement.
- 1.10.2 Prior to expiry of the original Proposal Validity Period, "SSU" may request that the Bidders extend the period of validity for a specified additional period. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid Security. A Bidder agreeing to the request will not be allowed to modify its Proposal, but would be required to extend the validity of its Bid Security for the period of extension and comply with Clause 1.10 of this document in all respects.
- 1.10.3 The successful bidder shall extend the proposal validity period till the date of execution of the Draft Service Agreement.

1.11 Project Inspection/Site Visit

1.11.1 The Bidder may carry out site visit at any time to understand the project feasibility at their own cost.

1.12 Bidder's Responsibility

1.12.1 The Bidder is expected to examine carefully the contents of all the documents provided. Failure to comply with the requirements of RFP Document will be at the Bidder's own risk.

1.12.2 It would be deemed that prior to the submission of proposal, the Bidder has:

- (a) made a complete and careful examination of requirements, and other information set forth in this RFP Document;
- (b) received all such relevant information as it has requested from "SSU"; and
- (c) made a complete and careful examination of the various aspects of the project including but not limited to:
 - (i) the project site
 - (ii) existing facilities and structures
 - (iii) space availability
 - (iv) the conditions of the access roads and utilities in the vicinity of the project Site
 - (v) conditions affecting transportation, access, disposal, handling and storage of the materials
 - (vi) clearances obtained by "SSU" for the project; and
 - (vii) All other matters that might affect the Bidder's performance under the terms of this RFP document.

1.12.3 "SSU" shall not be liable for any negligence or error made by the Bidder with respect to above.

1.13 Pre-Bid Meeting

1.13.1 To clarify and discuss issues with respect to the project and the RFP document, "SSU" will hold Pre-Bid meetings on date specified in the schedule of bidding process.

1.13.2 Prior to the Pre-Bid meetings, the Bidders may submit a list of queries and propose suggestions, if any, to execute the project and/or in the Draft Service Agreement. Bidders must formulate their responses and forward the same to "SSU" prior to the meeting as per RFP or as notified by the "SSU". After Pre-Bid "SSU" may or may not amend the RFP document and accordingly corrigendum shall be issued, if required or as decided by the "SSU".

1.13.3 The proposal submitted by the Bidders must be unconditional and "SSU" will not entertain any deviations to the RFP document at the time of submission of the proposal or thereafter. Bidders not satisfying RFP conditions would be deemed to have accepted the terms and conditions of the RFP document with all its contents including ~~the~~ and shall be responsible for rejection of bid on

the basis of not fulfilling RFP conditions. Any conditional proposal shall be treated as non-responsive and would be liable for rejection.

- 1.13.4 "SSU" will endeavour to hold the meeting as per Schedule of Bidding Process. The details of the meeting will be separately communicated to the Bidders.
- 1.13.5 Attendance of the Bidders at the Pre-Bid meeting is not mandatory. However, subsequent to the meeting, "SSU" may or may not respond to queries from any Bidder who has not attended the Pre-Bid meeting.

- 1.13.7 No interpretation, revision or other communication from "SSU" regarding this solicitation is valid unless in writing and is signed by State Project Director, Samagra Shiksha Uttarakhand or its authorised representative. "SSU" may or may not respond to Bidders queries including a description of the enquiry but without identifying its source to all the Bidders.

1.14 Format and Signing of Proposal

- 1.14.1 Bidders would provide all the information as per this RFP document in the specified formats or as stated. "SSU" reserves the right to reject any proposal/Bid that is not in the specified formats or not supported with requisite and authentic documents.
- 1.14.2 The Proposal should be submitted in three parts:

- Covering Letter cum Project Undertaking as per Appendix- 2 stating the proposal/bid validity period

- 1.16 Proposal Due Date**
- 1.16.1 Proposals should be submitted on or before 17:00 hrs. on the Bid/Proposal Due Date as mentioned in the Schedule of Bidding Process in this RFP, to the address provided in Clause 1.15 in the manner and form as detailed in this RFP Document. Applications submitted by either facsimile transmission or telex will not be acceptable.
- 1.16.2 "SSU", at its sole discretion, may extend the Bid/Proposal Due Date by issuing an Addendum in accordance with Clause 1.7
- 1.17 Late Proposals**
- 1.17.1 Any Bid/Proposal received by "SSU" after 17:00 hrs. on the Bid/Proposal Due Date will not be received and will not respond to Bidders' query in this regard.
- 1.18 Modification and Withdrawal of Proposals**
- 1.18.1 The Bidder may modify or withdraw its Proposal after submission, provided that written notice of the modification or withdrawal is received by "SSU" before the Bid/Proposal Due Date. No Proposal shall be modified or withdrawn by the Bidder after the closing time and Bid/Proposal Due Date. Please refer <https://uktenders.gov.in/> for instructions to modify or withdraw bid through e-procurement portal.

1.18.2 The Bidder's modification or withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked and delivered in accordance with the provisions of Clause 1.16 with outer envelopes additionally marked "MODIFICATION" or "WITHDRAWAL" and also "KEY SUBMISSIONS", "TECHNICAL PROPOSAL" as appropriate.

1.18.3 Withdrawal of a Proposal during the interval between the Proposal Due Date and expiration of the Proposal Validity Period would result in forfeiture of the Bid Security in accordance with RFP document.

1.19 Tests of responsiveness

1.19.1 Prior to evaluation of Proposals, "SSU" will determine whether each Proposal is responsive to the requirements of the RFP Document. A Proposal shall be considered responsive if

- (a) It is received as per schedule/proposal due date.
- (b) It is signed, sealed, and marked as stipulated in Clause 1.15.
- (c) It contains the information and documents as requested in the RFP including all certificates and all other supporting documents.
- (d) It contains information in formats specified in the RFP Document.
- (e) It mentions the proposal validity period as set out in Clause 1.10.
- (f) It provides the information in reasonable detail. ("Reasonable Detail" means that, but for minor deviations, the information can be reviewed and evaluated by "SSU" without communication with the Bidder).
- (g) There are no inconsistencies between the Proposal and the supporting documents.
- (h) It meets all eligibility criteria as mentioned in the RFP.
- (i) It is unconditional.

"SSU" reserves the right to determine whether the information has been provided in reasonable detail.

1.19.2 A Proposal that is substantially responsive is one that conforms to the preceding requirements without material deviation or reservation. A material deviation or reservation is one

- (a) which affects in any substantial way, the scope, quality, or performance of the Project, or
- (b) which limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with the RFP Document, "SSU" 's rights or the Bidder's obligations under the Service Agreement, or
- (c) Which would affect unfairly the competitive position of other Bidders presenting substantially responsive bids.

1.19.3 "SSU" reserves the right to reject any proposal which in its opinion is non-responsive and no request for modification or withdrawal shall be entertained by "SSU".

1.19.4 Conditional proposal shall not be considered and shall be rejected.

1.20 Confidentiality

1.20.1 Information relating to the examination, clarification, evaluation and recommendation for the short listed Bidders shall not be disclosed to any person not officially concerned with the process. "SSU" will treat all information submitted as part of proposal as confidential and ensure that all who have access to such material treat

it in confidence. "SSU" will not divulge any such information unless it is ordered to do so by any Government authority that has the power under law to require its disclosure.

1.21 Clarifications

1.21.1 To assist in the process of evaluation of Proposals, "SSU" may, at its sole discretion, ask any Bidder for clarification on its Proposal. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing or by facsimile. No change in the substance of the Proposal would be permitted by way of such clarifications.

1.22 Proposal Evaluation

1.22.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Proposals, "SSU" may utilise the services of consultant/s or advisor/s.

1.22.2 Before opening and evaluation of the Technical Proposals, Bidders are expected to meet the following **per-qualification criteria** which would be a part of the Technical Proposal. Bidders failing to meet per-qualification criteria or requisite proof for supporting per-qualification criteria are not submitted/attached with the Bid document, will be liable to be rejected at the Technical Proposal level.

- 1.22.4 The evaluation of the proposals shall be carried out in two steps, first the quality (technical proposal) and then the cost (financial proposal).
- 1.22.5 Evaluators of technical proposal shall not have access to the financial proposal until the technical evaluation is concluded.
- 1.22.6 Technical evaluation will be carried out on the basis of responsiveness to the key submission.
- 1.22.7 After the evaluation of quality is completed. Financial proposal of qualified firms shall be opened.

- 1.22.8 In Stage I of Proposal Evaluation, the Key Submissions submitted by the Bidders shall be checked for responsiveness with the requirements of the RFP Document.
- 1.22.9 The evaluation of Technical Proposal of a Bidder shall be taken up only after the contents of the Key Submissions are found to meet the requirements of this RFP Document. "SSU" reserves the right to reject the Proposal of a Bidder without opening the Technical Proposal if the contents of Key Submissions are not substantially responsive with the requirements of this RFP Document.

2. SCOPE OF THE PROJECT

National Education Policy 2020 has emphasized to promote Vocational Education at school level and has set a target for orientation of at least 50% students at secondary level by 2025. However, prior to NEP 2020 Government of India had already brought out a revised Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Vocational Education of Secondary Education (CSSVE) by integrating employability education into School Education in September 2011. The scheme is operated within the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF), earlier called NVEQF, which establishes a system of clear educational pathways from school to higher education while providing certification of vocational skills.

Uttarakhand State has also decided to implement National Skills Qualifications Framework(NSQF) in Uttarakhand and from academic year 2020-2021, vocational education has been made part of school education and since 2021-22 project is being implemented in 200 Government schools across the state for class 9 onwards aiming to make students employable when they complete secondary education. In continuation of it, vocational education is to be implemented in 331 Govt. Schools from the financial year 2023-24.

3.1. Project Overview

- Uttarakhand Sabhi Ke Liye Shiksha Parishad- Samagra Shiksha has implemented various projects at secondary and senior secondary school level to provide quality education to the students.

- r) Regular in-service training programmes of 5 days or 40 hours on pedagogy, subject content and other related aspects of vocational education should be organized for all teachers/skill trainers every year through qualified experts or established training institutes like PSSCIVE. Blended Training approach and Technology may be adopted.
- s) To provide students text books and digital learning content and teachers hand books/Digital Equipment based on the curriculum/text books prescribed by PSSCIVE in Hindi language in specific job role through NCERT/CBSE.
- t) To provide training modules, multimedia packages and e-Learning material to students as and when required.
- u) Evaluation and certification of the students will be done through certified assessor of concerned Sector Skill Council and Uttarakhand Board of School Education, Ramnagar (Nainital).

Hereinafter referred to as “**The Bidder/Service Provider**”

Preamble

The Purchaser intends to award, under laid down organizational procedures, contract/s for "**Implementation of the Vocational Education Programme in Government Secondary Schools of Uttarakhand**". The Purchaser values full compliance with all relevant laws of the land, rules, regulations, economic use of resources and of fairness/transparency in its relations with its Bidder(s) and/or Contractor(s).

In order to achieve these goals, the Purchaser will appoint an independent External Monitor(EM), who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

Section I-Commitment of the Purchaser

1. The Purchaser commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles: -
 - a. No employee of the Purchaser, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of the contract demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the person is not legally entitled to.
 - b. The Purchaser will, during the tender process, treat all Bidder(s) with equity and reason. The Purchaser will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidder(s) the same information and will not provide to any Bidder(s) confidential/additional information through which the Bidder(s) could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.
 - c. The Purchaser will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.
2. If the Purchaser obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a criminal offence under the IPC/PS Act, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Purchaser will inform the Chief Vigilance Officer and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.
- 3.

Section II-Commitments of the Bidder(s)/ Service Provider

1. The Bidder(s)/service provider commit himself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles during



his participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.

- a. The Bidder(s)/service provider will not offer any illicit gratification to obtain unfair advantage. They will not directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to any of the Purchaser's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material or other benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract the Bidder(s)/service provider will not collude with other parties to impair transparency and fairness and will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.
 - b. The Bidder(s)/service provider will not commit any offence under the relevant IPC/PC Act; further the Bidder(s)/service provider will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Purchaser as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
 - c. The Bidder(s)/service provider of foreign origin shall disclose the name and address of the Agents/representatives in India, if any. Further details as mentioned in the "Guidelines on Indian Agents of Foreign Suppliers" shall be disclosed by the Bidder(s)/service provider. Further, as mentioned in the Guidelines, all payments made to the Indian Agent/representative have to be Indian Rupees only.
 - d. The Bidder(s)/service provider will, when presenting the bid, disclose any and all payments it has made, is committed to, or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
2. The Bidder(s)/service provider will not instigate third persons to commit offenses outlined above or be an accessory to such offenses.

Section III-Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future contracts

If the Bidder(s)/service provider, before award or during execution has committed a transgression through a violation of Section II above, or in any other forms such as to put his reliability or credibility in question, the Purchaser is entitled to disqualify the Bidder(s)/service provider from the tender process and blacklist the Bidder(s)/service provider from any future contracts

Section IV-Compensation for Damages

1. If the Purchaser disqualifies a Bidder(s)/service provider from the tender



process prior to the award according to Section III, the Purchaser is entitled to demand and recover the damages equivalent to Bid Security against the EarnestMoneyDeposit.

2. If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section III, or if the Purchaser is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section III, the Purchaser shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contract or liquidated damages as mentioned in the RFP

Section V-Previous Transgressions

1. The Bidder(s)/service provider declares that no previous transgressions occurred in the last 3 years with any other company in any country conforming to the anti corruption approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
2. If the Bidder(s)/service provider makes incorrect statement on this subject, it can be disqualified from the tender process or action can be taken against it as mentioned in Section III of this pact.

Section VI-Equal Treatment of all Bidder(s)/Service Provider(s)

1. The Bidder(s)/service provider undertake(s) to demand from all a commitment in conformity with this Integrity Pact, and to submitittothePurchaserbefore contract signing.
2. The Purchaser will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

Section VII-Pact Duration

The Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Bidder(s)/service provider 6 months after the last payment under the contract.

If a claim is made/lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of thispactasspecifiedabove,unlessitisdischarged/determined by State Project Director Samagra Shiksha Uttarakhand, Dehradun.

Section VIII-Other Provisions

1. This agreement is subject to Indian Law, Place of Performance and jurisdiction is the Registered Office of the Purchaser i.e.Dehradun, Uttarakhand
2. Changes and Supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing.

3. Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come an agreement to their original intentions.

3. Definitions & Interpretations

In this Agreement, the following words and expressions shall, unless repugnant to
the context or meaning thereof, have the meaning hereinafter respectively ascribed
to them hereunder:

"Additional Cost" shall mean the additional capital expenditure and/or the
additional operating costs or VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMME as the
case may be, which the Service Provider would be required to incur as a result of
Change in Law.

"Affected Party" shall mean the Party claiming to be affected by a Force Majeure
Event in accordance with Article 8.1.

"Agreement" shall mean this Agreement, and includes any amendments hereto
made in accordance with the provisions hereof.

"Applicable Law" shall mean all laws in force and effect, as of the date hereof, and
which may be promulgated or brought into force and effect hereinafter in India
including judgments, decrees, injunctions, writs or orders of any court of record, as
may be in force and effect during the subsistence of this Agreement and applicable
to the Project/the Service Provider.

"Applicable Permits" shall mean all clearances, permits, authorisations, consents
and approvals required to be obtained or maintained by the Service Provider under
Applicable Law, in connection with the Project during the subsistence of this
Agreement.

"Appointed Date" shall mean the date of this Agreement.

"Arbitration Act" shall mean the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and shall
include any amendment to or any re-enactment thereof as in force from time to time.

"Change in Law" shall have the meaning ascribed thereto in Clause 8.2.

"COD" or "Commencement of Operations Date" shall mean the date on which the
Service Provider has started the **IMPLEMENTATION OF THE VOCATIONAL
EDUCATION PROGRAMME IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS OF
UTTARAKHAND** shall in any case not be later than expiry of

Implementation Period. It shall be subject to successful certification of the labs and deployment of the teachers.

“Department” means Department of Secondary Education or Samagra Shiksha or NSQF State cell.

“Emergency” shall mean a condition or situation that is likely to endanger the safety of the individuals on or about the Project Facility including the safety of the users thereof or which poses an immediate threat of material damage to the Project.

“Encumbrance” shall mean any encumbrance such as mortgage, charge, pledge, lien, hypothecation, security interest, assignment, privilege or priority of any kind having the effect of security or other such obligations and shall include without limitation any designation of loss payees or beneficiaries or any similar arrangement under any insurance policy pertaining to the Project, physical encumbrances, claims for any amounts due on account of taxes, cess, electricity, water and other utility charges and encroachments on the Project Facility.

“Financing Documents” shall mean collectively the documents evidencing Lenders’ commitment to finance the Project.

“Financial Year” shall mean the period commencing from April 1 of any given year to March 31 of the succeeding year.

“Force Majeure” or **“Force Majeure Event”** shall mean an act, event, condition or occurrence as specified in Article 8.

“Good Industry Practice” shall mean the exercise of that degree of skill, diligence, prudence and foresight in compliance with the undertakings and obligations under this Agreement which would reasonably and ordinarily be expected of a skilled and an experienced person engaged in the implementation, operation and maintenance or supervision or monitoring thereof of any of them of a project similar to that of the Project.

“Government Agency” shall mean Government of India, any state government or governmental department, commission, board, body, bureau, agency, authority, instrumentality, court or other judicial or administrative body, central, state, or local, having jurisdiction over the Service Provider, the Project Site or any portion thereof, or the performance of all or any of the services or obligations of the Service Provider under or pursuant to this Agreement.

“Material Adverse Effect” shall mean a material adverse effect on (a) the ability of the Service Provider to exercise any of its rights or perform/discharge any of its duties/obligations under and in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement and/or (b) the legality, validity, binding nature or enforceability of this Agreement.

“Material Breach” shall mean a breach by either Party of any of its obligations under this Agreement which has or is likely to have a Material Adverse Effect on the Project and which such Party shall have failed to cure.

“NSQF” means National Skills Qualification framework state cell

“Operations Period” shall mean the period commencing from COD and ending at the expiry of the agreement.

“Parties” shall mean the parties to this Agreement and **“Party”** shall mean either of them, as the context may admit or require.

“Performance Security” shall mean the bank guarantee for performance of its obligations to be procured by the Service Provider in accordance with the clause 5.1.

“Person” shall mean (unless otherwise specified or required by the context), any individual, company, corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, unincorporated organization, government or Government Agency or any other legal entity.

“Preliminary Notice” or Notice shall mean the notice of intended Termination by the Party entitled to terminate this Agreement to the other Party setting out, inter alia, the underlying Event of Default.

“Project” shall mean financing, operation and maintenance of Project at Project Site in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

“Project Agreements” shall mean collectively this Agreement and any other material contract (other than Financing Documents) entered into or may hereafter be entered into by the Service Provider in connection with the Project.

“Project Requirements” shall mean VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMME Requirements or any of them as the context may admit or require.

“Project Site” shall mean the built up space provided to the Service Provider within the existing school buildings for operation & implantation of the vocational education, more fully described in Schedule 1.

“Rupees” or “Rs.” refers to the lawful currency of the Republic of India.

“RFP” shall mean Request for Proposal.

“SPD” means State Project Director, Samagra Shiksha, Dehradun.

“SSU” means Samagra Shiksha, Uttarakhand.

“SPO” means State Project Officer, Samagra Shiksha, Uttarakhand.

"Services" means the work to be performed by the Bidder pursuant to this contract as described in Terms of Reference or RFP.

"Special Officer" means officer in charge of NSQF state cell

"Termination" shall mean early termination of the agreement, pursuant to Termination Notice or otherwise in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement but shall not, unless the context otherwise requires, include expiry of this Agreement due to efflux of time in the normal course.

"Termination Date" shall mean the date specified in the Termination Notice as the date on which Termination occurs.

"Termination Notice" shall mean the notice of Termination by either Party to the other Party, in accordance with the applicable provisions of this Agreement.

"Vocational Teacher" means the personnel authorized to teach the Trade specific vocational subject in the selected schools.

4. Interpretation

In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires,

- (a) any reference to a statutory provision shall include such provision as is from time to time modified or re-enacted or consolidated so far as such modification or re-enactment or consolidation applies to, or is capable of being applied to any transactions entered into hereunder;
- (b) references to Applicable Law shall include the laws, acts, ordinances, rules, regulations, notifications, guidelines or bylaws which have the force of law;
- (c) the words importing singular shall include plural and vice versa, and words denoting natural persons shall include partnerships, firms, companies, corporations, joint ventures, trusts, associations, organizations or other entities (whether or not having a separate legal entity);
- (d) the headings are for convenience of reference only and shall not be used in, and shall not affect, the construction or interpretation of this Agreement;
- (e) the words "include" and "including" are to be construed without limitation;
- (f) any reference to day, month or year shall mean a reference to a calendar day, calendar month or calendar year respectively;
- (g) any reference to any period commencing "from" a specified day or date and "till" or "until" a specified day or date shall include VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMME such days or dates;
- (h) Any reference to any period of time shall mean a reference to that according to Indian Standard Time (IST).
- (i) the Schedules to this Agreement form an integral part of this Agreement as though they were expressly set out in the body of this Agreement;

- (j) any reference at any time to any agreement, deed, instrument, license or document of any description shall be construed as reference to that agreement, deed, instrument, license or other document as amended, varied, supplemented, modified or suspended at the time of such reference;
- (k) references to recitals, Articles, sub-articles, clauses, or Schedules in this Agreement shall, except where the context otherwise requires, be deemed to be references to recitals, Articles, sub-articles, clauses and Schedules of or to this Agreement;
- (l) any agreement, consent, approval, authorization, notice, communication, information or report required under or pursuant to this Agreement from or by any Party shall be valid and effectual only if it is in writing under the hands of duly authorized representative of such Party in this behalf and not otherwise;
- (m) the damages payable by either Party to the other of them as set forth in this Agreement, whether on per diem basis or otherwise, are mutually agreed genuine pre-estimated loss and damage likely to be suffered and incurred by the Party entitled to receive the same and are not by way of penalty or liquidated damages (the "Damages")

Service Assignment

ARTICLE 2

2.1. Grant of Service Assignment

Subject to and in accordance with the terms and covenants set forth in this Agreement, the Authority hereby grants and authorizes the Service Provider to finance, to establish, operate and maintain the Vocational Education/Training Program, Labs and to exercise and/ or enjoy the rights, powers, benefits, privileges, authorizations and entitlements as set forth in this Agreement, (the “**Service Agreement**”).

2.2 Service Assignment Period

- a) *The Assignment hereby granted is initially for a period of 04 (four years) years from the date of signing of this agreement* (hereinafter referred to as the “Service Assignment Period”).
- b) Provided, in the event of Termination, the Service Assignment Period shall mean and be limited to the period commencing from the Appointed Date and ending with the Termination Date.
- c) *After the completion of Service Assignment period four (4) years, the Uttarakhand Sabhi Ke Liye Shiksha Parishad- SSU may extend the Assignment period subject to the condition that the Service Provider, during the four (4) year period, has satisfactorily fulfilled the project objectives, deliverables, has not indulged in any unfair practice and adhered to all the operation and maintenance standard laid out.*
- d) The performance evaluation of the Service Provider during the initial four (4) years would be based on, among other sources, the reports of Project Monitoring Committee and other monitoring mechanism of SSU.
- e) The SSU at the time of signing of this agreement is not providing any assurance that the Initial Assignment period of four (4) years would necessarily be extended after the fourth (4th) year.
- f) After completion of two years (I.e. for Class IX & X), project shall be implemented in class XI & XII as per Govt. of India approval.
- g) The Service Assignment period, if extended would be based on same or revised terms as deemed fit for the department and conditions to be negotiated at that point of time wherein first-right-of-refusal will be with the Service Provider.

2.3 Acceptance of Service Assignment

In consideration of SSU agreeing to permit the Service Provider to receive the program fees and the rights, privileges and benefits

conferred upon by the Authority and other good and valuable consideration expressed herein, the Service Provider hereby accepts the Service Assignment and agrees and undertakes to perform/ discharge all of its obligations in accordance with the provisions hereof.

Project Site

ARTICLE 3

3.1 Handover of Project Site

- (a) SSU shall, within 15 (fifteen) days from the Appointed Date, handover to the Service Provider, vacant and peaceful physical possession of the Class rooms along with available infrastructure in the schools covered under Project Site for the purpose of implementing the Project. SSU shall provide space in existing premises to the Assignment free of cost and no rent shall be charged from the Service Provider.
- (b) Upon the Project Site being handed over pursuant to the preceding Clause (a), the Service Provider shall, subject to the provisions of Article 5, have the right to enter upon, occupy and use the same and to make at its costs, charges and expenses such investigation, and improvements in the Project Site as may be necessary or appropriate to implement the Project in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

3.2 Rights, Title and Use of the Project Site

- (a) The Service Provider shall have the right to the use of Project Site in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement and for this purpose it may regulate the entry and use of the same by third parties.
- (b) *The Project Site including the Project Facility developed thereon belongs to SSU and shall continue to be the property of SSU.*
- (c) The Service Provider shall not part with or create any Encumbrance on the whole or any part of the Project Site.
- (d) The Service Provider shall not use the Project Facility for any purpose other than for the purpose of the Project and purposes incidental or ancillary thereto without the prior written approval of the SSU..
- (e) *The Service Provider shall allow access to and use of the Project Site for laying/ installing/ maintaining telegraph lines, electric lines or for such other public purposes as SSU may specify.*

Provided that such access or use shall not result in a Material Adverse Effect and that SSU shall, in the event of any physical damage to the Project Site/

Project Facility/on account thereof, ensure that the Project Site/ Project Facility is promptly restored at its cost and expenses.

Provided further, that to the extent such access and use allowed by the Service Provider affects the performance of any of its obligations hereunder, the Service Provider shall not be deemed or construed to be in breach of its obligations nor shall it incur/ suffer any liability on account thereof.

- (f) The Service Provider shall use the Project in the school hours. The regular school hours are defined in Schedule 3.
- (g) *The Service Provider shall not demolish any existing structure on the Project Site without written permission of the SSU.*

3.3 Peaceful Possession

SSU, as Assigning Authority, hereby warrants that:

- (a) The Project Site together with the necessary right of way/ way-leaves
 - (i) has been acquired through the due process of law
 - (ii) belongs to and is vested in SSU and that SSU has full powers to hold, dispose of and deal with the same consistent, inter alia, with the provisions of this Agreement and that the Service Provider shall, in respect of the Project Site, have no liability regarding any compensation payment on account of rehabilitation/ resettlement or land acquisition of any Persons affected thereby.
- (b) The Service Provider shall, subject to complying with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, remain in peaceful possession and enjoyment of the Project Site or part thereof until expiry of the Assignment Period/ completion of Hand back Requirements. In the event, the Service Provider is obstructed by any Person claiming any right, title or interest in or over the Project Site or any part thereof or in the event of any enforcement action including any attachment, distraint, appointment of receiver or liquidator being initiated by any Person claiming to have any interest in/charge on the Project Site or any part thereof, SSU shall, if called upon by the Service Provider, defend such claims and proceedings and also keep the Service Provider indemnified against any consequential loss or damages which the Service Provider may suffer, on account of any such right, title, interest or charge.

3.4 Applicable Permits

The Service Provider shall obtain and maintain all Applicable Permits in such sequence as is consistent with the requirements of the Project.

- 4.1. Implementation Period shall start from the Appointed Date and would continue as indicated below :

- 4.2. During the Implementation Period the Service Provider shall in consultation with SSU finalise the time schedule for operating and managing Vocational Education Programme in all the schools.
- 4.3. During the Implementation Period the SSU shall undertake the following activities in consultation with the Service Provider :
- Prepare the induction / In service training program for the Vocational Teachers.
 - Prepare the books and other material for Vocation Education Program and ensure its delivery to schools
 - Prepare a list of Government Students to be catered under the programme.
 - Prepare an inventory of items to be provided in all the schools for the Vocational Education program.
 - Select the third party agency/person for the inspection and verification of the vocational education labs for each trade and inform the Service Provider.
 - Prepare the necessary monitoring mechanism for the project at school, district and USSP
- 4.4. After setting up of the labs at each location, Samagra Shiksha will accept the Lab Readiness Certificate as provisional certificate from Block Level Committee to commence the operations. The service provider shall ensure that the labs are inspected and approved by the designated third party employed by the Authority. **The appointed third party would issue the lab completion certificate.** Committee will inspect the site within 2 days after intimation by service provider and share visit report within two days from Visit.
- 4.5. Samagra Shiksha Uttarakhand and the Service Provider shall work together to complete the third party certificate for final Lab Completion certificate within 15 working days of the issue of provisional certificate.

- 4.6. After completion of Manpower recruitment, the service provider shall duly inform SSU regarding completion of the milestone.
- 4.7. The project roll out would commence with the induction training of instructors/vocational teachers by the Authority. The vocational teachers shall be deployed in schools after the completion of induction training.
- 4.8. The classes shall begin in Academic Year 2023-24 and accordingly recurring expenses shall be reimbursed as applicable. Initial class shall be Class IXth in the first year and in second year IXth and Xth.
- 4.9. After completion of first two years project shall be extended for class XI & XIIth subject to approval given by Govt. Of India.

Service Provider's Obligations

ARTICLE 5

In addition to and not in derogation or substitution of any of its other obligations under this Agreement, the Service Provider shall have the following obligations:

5.1 Performance Security

- (a) The Service Provider shall, for due and punctual performance of its obligations hereunder relating to the Project, deliver to SSU, simultaneously with the execution of this Agreement, a bank guarantee from a scheduled bank acceptable to SSU, in the form as set forth in Schedule 4, ("Performance Security") for a sum of Rs...../- (Rupees only) submit to SSU within 15 days of release of work order/Letter of Intend.
- (b) The Performance Security shall be kept valid for throughout the Service Assignment Period/Contract period from the Appointed Date (**initially for two years I.e. 2 x 365 days plus 60 days**).

Provided that if the Agreement is terminated due to any event other than a Service Provider Event of Default, the Performance Security if subsisting as of the Termination Date shall, subject to SSU's right to receive amounts, if any, due from the Service Provider under this Agreement, be duly discharged and released to the Service Provider.

5.2 Vocation Education Program

- 5.2.1 The Service Provider shall implement the programme as per NSQF guidelines to achieve following objectives :



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- (i) Successfully introduce and integrate vocational courses (NSQF compatible) initially at the Class IXth in first year and up to Class XIIth in four years on an optional/ voluntary basis in 331 selected schools in Uttarakhand from the academic year 2023-24 subject to approval of the programme from Govt. of India from year to year.
- (ii) NSQF project is to formalize the way the training as per National Occupational Standards (NOS) are conducted and to standardize the outcome of the trainings, i.e. quality of students with respect to both technical skills as well as work readiness for the entry level job roles in the relevant sector at the end of Level 4. Post Level 4, students have the options to go for employment or continue the studies. Currently Samagra Shiksha Uttarakhand plans to offer NSQF Courses in Seven streams-Information Technology-Information Technology Enabled Services (IT-ITEs), Automotive, Beauty & Wellness, Tourism & Hospitality, Agriculture, Electronic & Hardware and Plumber. In future more streams can be included under this scheme.

5.2.2 The service provider will be responsible for the following in the proposed programme covering 331 secondary schools. Among these 81 schools are situated in plain area and 250 schools are situated in hilly area. The service provider shall :

- a) Provide resource persons including teachers/skill trainers, skill knowledge providers, industry coordinators, guest faculty as per requirement of the project.
- b) Service Provider shall deploy 01 qualified vocational teacher in selected school for each trade. However, deployment of Vocational Teacher will be as per trade operated in a selected school i.e. if more than 01 trade is operational in any school then 01 Vocational Teacher shall be for each trade.
- c) After initial 02 years I.e. Class IXth & Xth, If programme is extended to Classes XIth & XIIth Service Provider shall deploy additional Vocational Teacher for each trade as agreed by the client/SSU in accordance with Qualification of NSDC and as annexure/schedule 5.
- d) After first 02 years programme evaluation/feedback shall be considered for continuation of Service Provider. Client or first party reserves right to add new clause to this MoU in the interest of students, if any required.
- e) Procure tools, equipment and computers in all 331 schools, to establish vocational education labs for IT/ITeS, Agriculture, Tourism & Hospitality, Beauty & Wellness, Automotive, Electronic & Hardware and Plumber with minimum equipment and specifications as provided in **Schedule 6**.
- f) Ensure arrangement of maintenance of tools and equipments, software and e-

- g) Ensure hands on skill training/on job training to students in industrial and commercial establishments for at least 80 hours or twice a year (for one week each) in a job role.
- h) Ensure internal assessment of the students.
- i) Ensure theoretical and practical classes as per NSQF guidelines.
- j) Ensure students, parents, teachers and community mobilization in selected schools.
- k) Create awareness among the students, parents, teachers and community for the vocational education.
- l) Provide guidance and counselling services to the students as and when required.
- m) Ensure minimum three field visit/educational tours to the student for their improvement in practical exposure and expose them to activities in the work place.
- n) Ensure day-to-day requirements of stationary and other consumables for conducting the classes.
- o) To ensure apprenticeship to at least 70% of the interested students who are below the age of 18 and Provide placement to the eligible students in related job market after passing out the level IV certificate or give jobs to at least 70% of the interested students who are 18 years and above of age.
- p) Organize minimum 20 guest faculty lecture in each relating subject/trade in every selected schools in one academic year. Technology can be leveraged.
- q) Management Information System (MIS) would be developed for monitoring of the scheme.
- r) To provide Induction /in service Training to teachers. The induction and in service training shall be imperative to bridge the current gap between demand and availability of qualified teachers/skill trainers and to keep the teachers/skill trainers abreast with industry requirements.
- s) Regular in-service training programmes of 5 days or 40 hours on pedagogy, subject content and other related aspects of vocational education should be organized for all teachers/skill trainers every year. Training support may be taken through established training institutes like PSSCIVE having necessary experiences and expertise. Blended Training approach and Technology should be adopted.
- t) To provide students text books and digital learning content and teachers hand books/Digital Equipment based on the curriculum/text books prescribed by PSSCIVE in Hindi language in specific job role through NCERT/CBSE.

- u) To provide training modules, multimedia packages and e-Learning material to students as and when required.
- v) Evaluation and certification of the students through certified assessor of concerned Sector Skill Council and Uttarakhand Vidyalayee Shiksha Parishad, Ramnagar (Nainital).

5.3 Course curriculum

5.3.1 The Syllabus covered in the program shall be provided by SSU developed by PSSCIVE/NCERT/CBSE/Suggested by Uttarakhand State Board.

5.3.2 The service provider shall ensure the effective delivery of this curriculum.

5.4 Study Material

5.4.1 The Service Provider shall provide the basic classroom material like student stationary and other teaching accessories for effective delivery of vocational education program.

5.4.2 The books of course curriculum shall be provided by the Service Provider based on Curriculum of PSSCIVE/NCERT/CBSE in Hindi language.

5.4.3 Students shall be encouraged to take up innovative project work during the academic year. SSU shall provide funds to support such project expenses through school principal.

5.5 Teaching Staff

5.5.1 Service Provider shall deploy 01 qualified vocational teacher in selected school for each trade. However, deployment of Vocational Teacher will be as per trade operated in a selected school I.e. if more than 01 trade is operational in any school then 01 Vocational Teacher shall be for each trade.

5.5.2 The selection and recruitment process for the teachers shall be transparent; merit based and shall be in accordance with the norms set by the state Government for transparent deployment. The process may be conducted in consultation with the SSU. SSU may provide guideline or suggestions for this purpose or as directed by the GoI time to time.

5.5.3 The teaching staff should be well qualified and consistency should be strictly maintained. In case, any teacher is found unsuitable, the Service Provider shall make an alternative arrangement within 15 days. The decision, of SSU in this regard will be final.

5.5.4 Service provider shall evaluate performance of the deployed manpower at its own and accordingly continuity shall be made.

- 5.5.5 The educational qualifications and experience of the teaching staff should be able to impart the functional English skill programme as per objective and outcomes. The minimum educational qualifications of the teaching staff should be as **per Schedule 5**.
- 5.5.6 The Service Provider shall ensure that the instructor/teacher is familiar with the study material and he/she has adequate training to conduct the prescribed course.
- 5.5.7 In case it is found by SSU that the qualification of the Teaching Staff is less than that prescribed or the quality of teaching is found below satisfactory level, the Service Provider shall immediately replace the Teaching Staff at its own cost and expense.
- 5.5.8 The teaching staff should be paid in accordance with minimum wage laws and also in accordance with good industry practices. A transparent payment mechanism should be established to avoid any corruption or pilferage in the system.
- 5.6 Vocational Education Program Assessment & Evaluation**
- 5.6.1 The Service Provider shall also deploy methods of continuous assessment of the students in order to ensure effective roll out of the program.
- 5.6.2 SSU and Uttarakhand Board shall conduct the assessment and evaluation as per the NSQF and the service provider shall ensure preparation for these assessment and evaluations.
- 5.6.3 The service provider shall also prepare students for level certification as per NSQF requirements with the help of concerned Sector Skill Council & Uttarakhand Vidyalayee Shiksha Parishad, Ramnagar (State Board).
- 5.7 Setting up of the vocational education labs**
- 5.7.1 The service provider shall establish the vocation education labs as per NSQF standards and specifications in the selected schools as per trade requirement.
- 5.7.2 The labs shall be inspected and certified by the third party agency/ experts nominated by the SSU.
- 5.7.3 The labs should be operated and maintained by the service provider to ensure that all equipment remains functional with 90% uptime.
- 5.8 Operation & Maintenance of the Project Facility**

5.8.1 No activity other than Vocational Education program shall be carried out by the Service Provider in the selected schools separately or with the name of project Facility without prior written approval of the SSU.

5.8.2 The Service Provider shall not sublet, transfer or assign the Project or any part thereof without prior written consent of SSU. In the event of the Service Provider contravening this condition, SSU shall have right to terminate the Agreement at the risk and cost of the Service Provider.

5.9 Repair and Maintenance of the Project Facility

5.9.1 Any major repairs and maintenance of the Project Facility, class rooms and other major infrastructure or any part thereof shall be undertaken by the USSP in consultation with the Service Provider.

5.9.2 Repairs and Maintenance of Vocational Education Lab, its equipment etc. shall be responsibility of the Service Provider. The expenses for the same be met by the service provider from the recurring expenses quoted by them.

5.9.3 All the repair and maintenance activities shall be duly logged by the service provider and shall be made part of the reporting system. The report should indicate also the cost incurred on such repairs.

5.10 Financing Arrangement

5.10.1 The Service Provider shall at its cost; expenses and risk make such financing arrangement as would be necessary to implement the Project and to meet all of its obligations under this Agreement, in a timely manner.

5.10.2 The service provider shall be paid on performance basis only by SSU as mentioned in the **Schedule 2 & subject service levels as per Schedule 7.**

5.11 Students Records

5.11.1 The Service Provider shall keep all the Students Records of following details throughout the Service Assignment Period :

- a. Name Number of students enrolled for the course.
- b. Daily attendance of the students & Teacher
- c. Academic Progress Details
- d. Assignments & Performance Details
- e. Projects carried out by the student.
- f. Trade specific Calendar for VE implemented in the school.

5.11.2 SSU may at any time throughout the Service Assignment Period inspect the record maintained by the Service Provider.

5.11.3 These records should be available on the MIS as stated in the clause 5.18.1

5.12 Reporting Systems

5.12.1 The Service provider shall be obliged to provide daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual reports for the project in accordance with the system agreed with SSU.

5.12.2 USSP should put in place a mechanism for endorsement of these reports at school level.

5.12.3 The service provider shall ensure that offline and online reporting compliance is achieved during the entire assignment period.

5.13 Validity of certificate (NSDC/SSC affiliation certificate)

The Implementing Partner should keep NSDC/SSC affiliation certificate valid until the end of the agreement period.

5.14 Insurance

The equipment and services supplied under the Agreement by the Service Provider shall be fully insured by the Service Provider against loss, theft or damage incidental to the manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage, delivery and installation and operations. The period of insurance shall be for the entire Service Assignment Period.

5.15 Indemnity by Service Provider

The Service Provider shall indemnify and hold harmless SSU and their employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses arising out of or resulting from Service Provider's negligence or breach in execution of the O&M requirement and any activity incidental thereto.

5.16 General Obligations

The Service Provider shall at its own cost and expense:

- (a) investigate, study, operate and maintain the Project Facility in accordance with the provisions hereof;
- (b) obtain all Applicable Permits as required by or under the Applicable Law and be in compliance thereof at all times during the Service Assignment Period;
- (c) comply with Applicable Law governing the operations of the Project Facility, as the case may be, at all times during the Service Assignment Period;
- (d) procure and maintain in full force and effect, as necessary, appropriate procurements, agreements and permissions for materials,

methods, processes and systems used in or incorporated into the Project ;

- (e) appoint, supervise, monitor and control as necessary, the activities of Contractors under the respective Project Agreements;
- (f) make efforts to maintain harmony and good relations among the personnel employed in connection with the performance of its obligations under this Agreement and solely liable for all possible claims and employment related liabilities of its staff employed in relation with the Project and hereby indemnifies SSU against any claims, damages, expenses or losses in this regard and that in no case and shall for no purpose shall SSU be treated as employer in this regard;
- (g) be responsible for all the health, security, environment and safety aspects of the Project Site/ Project Facility, as the case may be, at all times during the Service Assignment Period;
- (h) ensure that the Project Site remains free from all encroachments and take all steps necessary to remove encroachments, if any;
- (i) upon receipt of a request thereof, afford access to the Project Facility to the authorized representatives of SSU for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the terms, covenants and conditions of this Agreement and to any Government Agency having jurisdiction over the Project, including those concerned with safety, security or environmental protection to inspect the Project Facility and to investigate any matter within their authority and upon reasonable notice, the Service Provider shall provide to such persons assistance reasonably required to carry out their respective duties and functions.
- (j) pay all taxes, duties and outgoings, including utility charges relating to the Project Facility, as applicable throughout the Service Assignment Period.
- (k) provide and maintain all necessary accommodation and welfare facilities for its staff. The Service Provider shall not permit any of its employees to maintain any temporary or permanent living quarters within the Project Site.
- (l) take precautions to ensure the health and safety of its staff.
- (m) take reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous or disorderly conduct by or among its staff to preserve peace and protection of persons and Project Site against such conduct.

5.17 No Breach of Obligations

The Service Provider shall not be considered to be in breach of its obligations under this Agreement nor shall it incur or suffer any liability if and to the extent performance of any of its obligations under this Agreement is affected by or on account of any of the following:

- (i) Force Majeure Event, subject to Clause 8.1;
- (ii) SSU

- (iii) Compliance with the instructions of the SSU or the directions of any Government Agency other than instructions issued as a consequence of a breach by the Service Provider of any of its obligations hereunder;
- (iv) Closure of the Project Facility or part thereof with the approval of SSU.

5.18 Monitoring and Assessment

5.18.1 MIS for Monitoring and Evaluation

Management Information System (MIS) would be developed by the Service Provider for monitoring of the scheme.

The Online MIS Software should be able to capture the following:

- (a) Student related information: Student details like name, roll no, schooling history, attendance, course/training module enrolled, web based tool to monitor student performance through evaluation/examination, curriculum and marks obtained etc. The use of 'Aadhar number' will be encouraged to track the students.
- (b) Teacher related information: Attendance, leave records, training details, lectures delivered etc.
- (c) Lab Equipment related information with maintenance and uptime records
- (d) Day-to-day teaching activities
- (e) Feedback module: To capture feedback from students, teachers, CEOs, DEO(S), BEOs/Dy. EOs Inspection teams etc.
- (f) Report generation: Software should be able to generate weekly and monthly reports as required by the Department from time to time. Formats and frequency of reports to be finalized in consultation with the SSU.
- (g) The MIS should also capture the payments.
- (h) Software shall be able to generated data school wise, Block wise and state wise.
- (i) Report format shall be decided with the consultation of SSU.

5.19 The Service Provider shall have a resource person or establish office in Dehradun for smooth functioning of project.

SSU's Obligations

ARTICLE 6

In addition to and not in derogation or substitution of any of its other obligations under this Agreement, SSU shall have the following obligations:



6.1 Specific Obligations

- (a) SSU shall identify and earmark the space/classrooms to be made available to the Service Provider during school hours in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement;
- (b) SSU shall handover a list of inventory consisting of details of infrastructure provided to the Service Provider.
- (c) SSU shall provide the list of Government Students to be covered by the programme.
- (d) SSU shall grant in a timely manner all such approvals, permissions and authorizations which the Service Provider may require or is obliged to seek from SSU under this Agreement, in connection with implementation of the Project and the performance of its obligations. SSU Shall make payment within 15 days of invoice receipt from service provider on monthly basis. Any adjustment will be done in the next invoice to ensure smooth project execution on ground.
- (e) SSU shall make all necessary arrangements for the inspection and certification of the labs by third party experts/agency.
- (f) SSU shall make all necessary arrangements for assessment of evaluation of the students under NSQF guidelines.
- (g) SSU shall ensure that all school and district level committees are in place for implementation and monitoring of the program.

6.2 General Obligations

SSU shall:

- (a) upon written request from the Service Provider, assist the Service Provider in obtaining access to all necessary infrastructure facilities and utilities, including water, electricity and telecommunication facilities at rates and on terms no less favorable to the Service Provider than those generally available to commercial customers receiving substantially equivalent facilities/utilities;
- (b) Observe and comply with all its obligations set forth in this Agreement.

6.2.1 SSU Monitoring and Evaluation

- (a) SSU shall form a three Tier Monitoring committee for the Programme as below :

- The committee shall submit its report to the government regarding the achievement of projects deliverables-low, moderate, satisfactory, excellent etc with specific recommendation(s) on the continuance of the engagement of the service provider. The findings of the expert committee would be considered to be final and binding.
- If the project deliverables are found to be moderate or low, the expert committee would direct SSU to plan corrective action(s) with the Service Provider and implement the same to achieve desired outputs within thirty (30) days.
- The expert committee shall evaluate project deliverables on a three monthly basis based on visit to the facility by designated members or representatives of the committee, review of auditors' reports, reports provided by Service Provider, information received from general public including project stakeholders etc.
- SSU shall facilitate the committee in information gathering, conducting facility visit, meetings, interviews etc.
- **Shall also ensure timely payments to the Service Provider and also ensure enforcement of penalties.**

District Level Committee

- i. Chief Education Officer - Chairman
- ii. District Education Officer , Secondary - Member, Secretary
- iii. Account Officer/ Assistant Account Officer - Member

- **Shall be responsible for monitoring the performance of the program in the district.**
- **Committee shall issue direction to BEO and School Principals for performance improvements.**

Block Level Committee

- i. Block Education Officer - Member
- ii. Dy. Education Officer - Member
- iii. Principal of School - Member

- **Shall be responsible for monitoring and inspection of the program in designated schools. Shall submit reports of inspections and visits to higher level.**
- **Shall conduct at least 1 visit every month to the schools in the block running Vocational program.**
- **Shall be responsible for day-to-day monitoring and inspection of the program in schools.**

- **Shall be responsible for endorsing the bills, attendance records and all the reports of the Service Provider.**
- (b) The service provider shall be required to provide information/ records/reports to these committees as and when requested.
- (c) The service provider shall be required to send its representative to the state committee /district committee/ Block committee meetings as and when asked for.

Service Assignment Payments

ARTICLE 7

7.1 Service Assignment Payment

- (a) The Authority agrees to make to the Service Provider payment in accordance with Schedule 2 ("Service Assignment Payment") at in accordance with the financial proposal submitted by the Service Provider.
- (b) The Payment would have two separate components :
 - a. The capital expenses towards establishing the vocational education labs
 - b. The monthly recurring payment for the conduct of the assignment.
- (c) The payments would be subject to the Service Levels and Penalties as described in the Schedule 7.
- (d) All payments shall be affected from the SSU office, Dehradun.
- (e) Bills & reports duly endorsed by the principal of school should be sent to SSU state office every month in original.
- (f) Payments to the service provider shall be made within 30 days from the receipt of bills by SSU.
- (g) Monthly bills shall be raised by the service provider.

7.2 Payments by the Service Provider to the project staff

- (a) The Service Provider shall ensure that the payments to the project staff are done in timely manner and not later than the 10th day of every month.
- (b) All payments to the staff shall be affected through NEFT/RTGS/E-Banking system and bank statements should be submitted as the proof while submitting the bills to the Authority.

Force Majeure and Change In Law

ARTICLE 8

8.1 Force Majeure Event

Neither party shall be responsible to the other for any delay or failure in performance of its obligations due to any occurrence commonly known as Force Majeure which is beyond the control of any of the parties, including, but not limited to, fire, flood, explosion, acts of God or any Governmental body, public disorder, riots, embargo, or strikes, acts of military authority, epidemics, strikes, lockouts or other labor disputes, insurrections, civil commotion, war, enemy actions. If a Force Majeure arises, the Service Provider shall promptly notify SSU in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by SSU, the Service Provider shall continue to perform his obligations under the Agreement as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event. The Service Provider shall be excused from performance of his obligations in whole or part as long as such causes, circumstances or events shall continue to prevent or delay such performance.

8.2 Change in Law

(a) Change in Law shall mean the occurrence or coming into force of any of the following, after the Appointed Date:

- (i) the enactment of any new Indian law;
- (ii) the repeal, modification or re-enactment of any existing Indian law;
- (iii) a change in the interpretation or application of any Indian law by a court of record.

Provided that Change in Law shall not include:

- (i) coming into effect, after the Appointed Date, of any provision or statute which is already in place as of the Appointed Date,
 - (ii) any new law or any change in the existing law under the active consideration of or in the contemplation of any government as of the Appointed Date which is a matter of public knowledge,
 - (iii) any change in the rates of the Central Taxes.
- (b) Subject to Change in Law resulting in Material Adverse Effect and subject to the Service Provider taking necessary measures to mitigate the impact or likely impact of Change in Law on the Project, if as a consequence of a Change in Law, the Service Provider is obliged to incur additional costs, SSU shall not reimburse any such cost.
- (c) Upon occurrence of a Change in Law, the Service Provider may, notify SSU of the following:
- (i) the nature and the impact of Change in Law on the Project
 - (ii) in sufficient detail, the estimate of the Additional Cost likely to be incurred by the Service Provider on account of Change in Law
 - (iii) the measures, which the Service Provider has taken or proposes to take to mitigate the impact of Change in Law, including in particular,

Events of Default and Termination

ARTICLE 9

9.1 Events of Default

Event of Default shall mean either Service Provider Event of Default or USSP Event of Default as the context may admit or require.

(a) Service Provider Event of Default

Any of the following events shall constitute an Event of Default by the Service Provider ("Service Provider Event of Default") unless such event has occurred as a result of one or more reasons set out in **Article 8**.

- (i) The Service Provider has failed to achieve COD within 60 days from the date of signing of the Agreement for any reason whatsoever;
- (ii) At any time during the Assignment Period, the Service Provider fails to adhere to the VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PORGRAMME Requirements and has failed to remedy the same within 30 days;
- (iii) The Service Provider has failed to make any payments due to SSU and more than 120 days have elapsed since such payment became due;
- (iv) The Service Provider is in Material Breach of any of its obligations under this Agreement and the same has not been remedied for more than 60 days ;
- (v) Any representation made or warranty given by the Service Provider under this Agreement is found to be false or misleading;
- (vi) A resolution has been passed by the shareholders of the Service Provider for voluntary winding up/ dissolution of the Service Provider;
- (vii) Any petition for winding up of the Service Provider has been admitted and liquidator or provisional liquidator has been appointed or the Service Provider has been ordered to be wound up by Court of competent jurisdiction, except for the purpose of amalgamation or reconstruction with the prior consent of SSU, provided that, as part of such amalgamation or reconstruction and the amalgamated or reconstructed entity has unconditionally assumed all surviving obligations of the Service Provider under this Agreement;
- (viii) A default has occurred under any of the Financing Documents and any of the Lenders has recalled its financial assistance and demanded payment of the amounts outstanding under the Financing Documents or any of them as applicable;
- (ix) The Service Provider has abandoned the Project Facility ;
- (x) The Service Provider has repudiated this Agreement or has otherwise expressed an intention not to be bound by this Agreement;
- (xi) The Service Provider has suffered an attachment levied on any of its assets which has caused or is likely to cause a Material Adverse Affect on the Project and such attachment has continued for a period exceeding 90 days
- (xii) The Service Provider has failed to perform/ discharge its obligations under Article 5 of the Agreement for a continuous period of 90 days.

(b) **SSU Event of Default**

Any of the following events shall constitute an event of default by SSU ("SSU Event of Default"), when not caused by a Service Provider Event of Default or a Force Majeure Event:

- (i) SSU is in Material Breach of any of its obligations under this Agreement and has failed to cure such breach within 60 days of receipt of notice thereof issued by the Service Provider;
- (ii) SSU having executed the same is in breach of any of its obligations there under and such breach has not been cured within 30 days from the date of written notice thereof given by the Service Provider
- (iii) SSU has repudiated this Agreement or otherwise expressed its intention not to be bound by this Agreement;
- (iv) SSU has unreasonably withheld or delayed grant of any approval or permission which the Service Provider is obliged to seek under this Agreement, and thereby caused or likely to cause Material Adverse Effect;
- (v) Any governmental action not arising out of a breach, default or lapse on the part of the Service Provider, whereby the this Agreement becomes inoperable or takeover by any government agency of the Project/ Project Facilities or any part thereof, thereby causing Material Adverse Effect.
- (vi) Any representation made or warranties given by the USSP under this Agreement has been found to be false or misleading.

9.2 Termination due to Event of Default

(a) **Termination for Service Provider Event of Default**

- (i) Without prejudice to any other right or remedy which SSU may have in respect thereof under this Agreement, upon the occurrence of a Service Provider Event of Default, SSU shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement in the manner as set out under Clause 9.2(a)(ii) and Clause 9.2(a)(iii).
- (ii) If SSU decides to terminate this Agreement pursuant to preceding clause (i), it shall in the first instance issue Preliminary Notice to the Service Provider. Within 30 days of receipt of the Preliminary Notice, the Service Provider shall submit to SSU in sufficient detail, the manner in which it proposes to cure the underlying Event of Default (the "Service Provider's Proposal to Rectify"). In case of non-submission of the Service Provider's Proposal to Rectify within the said period of 30 days, SSU shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement by issuing Termination Notice, and to appropriate the Performance Security, if subsisting.

(iii) If the Service Provider's Proposal to Rectify is submitted within the period stipulated therefore, the Service Provider shall have further period of 30 days ("Cure Period") to remedy/ cure the underlying Event of Default. If, however the Service Provider fails to remedy/ cure the underlying Event of Default within such further period allowed, SSU shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement, by issue of Termination Notice and to appropriate Performance Security, if subsisting.

(b) Termination for SSU Event of Default

- (i) Without prejudice to any other right or remedy which the Service Provider may have in respect thereof under this Agreement, upon the occurrence of SSU Event of Default, the Service Provider shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement by issuing Termination Notice.
- (ii) If the Service Provider decides to terminate this Agreement pursuant to preceding clause (i) it shall in the first instance issue Preliminary Notice to "SSU". Within 30 days of receipt of Preliminary Notice, "SSU" shall forward to the Service Provider its proposal to remedy/ cure the underlying Event of Default (the "SSU" Proposal to Rectify"). In case of non submission of "SSU" Proposal to Rectify within the period stipulated there for, Service Provider shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement by issuing Termination Notice.
- (iii) If SSU Proposal to Rectify is forwarded to the Service Provider within the period stipulated therefore, SSU shall have further period of 30 days to remedy/ cure the underlying Event of Default. If, however SSU fails to remedy/ cure the underlying Event of Default within such further period allowed, the Service Provider shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement by issuing Termination Notice.

(c) Termination Notice

If a Party is having become entitled to do so decide to terminate this Agreement pursuant to the preceding sub clause (a) or (b), it shall issue Termination Notice setting out:

- (i) in sufficient detail the underlying Event of Default;
- (ii) the Termination Date which shall be a date occurring not earlier than 30 days from the date of Termination Notice;
- (iii) the estimated termination payment including the details of computation thereof; and,
- (iv) any other relevant information.

(d) Obligation of Parties

Following issue of Termination Notice by either Party, the Parties shall promptly take all such steps as may be necessary or required to ensure that:

- (i) until Termination the Parties shall, to the fullest extent possible, discharge their respective obligations so as to maintain the continued operation of the Project Facility,
- (ii) the termination payment, if any, payable by SSU in accordance with the following Clause (f) is paid to the Service Provider on the Termination Date and
- (iii) the Project Facility is handed back to SSU by the Service Provider on the Termination Date free from any Encumbrance along with any payment that may be due by the Service Provider to SSU.

(e) Withdrawal of Termination Notice

Notwithstanding anything inconsistent contained in this Agreement, if the Party who has been served with the Termination Notice cures the underlying Event of Default to the satisfaction of the other Party at any time before the Termination occurs, the Termination Notice shall be withdrawn by the Party which had issued the same.

Provided that the Party in breach shall compensate the other Party for any direct costs/ consequences occasioned by the Event of Default which caused the issue of Termination Notice.

(f) Termination Payments on account of SSU Event of Default

Upon Termination of this Agreement on account of SSU Event of Default, the Service Provider shall be entitled to revoke the Performance Security, if subsisting and shall be entitled to all pending payments due to them.

(g) Termination Payments on account of Service Provider Event of Default

Upon Termination of this Agreement on account of Service Provider Event of Default, the SSU shall be entitled to receive the following amount

- i. Amount of Performance Security.
- ii. Any penalties due from the service provider

9.3 Rights of SSU on Termination

- (a) Upon Termination of this Agreement for any reason whatsoever, SSU shall upon making the Termination Payment, if any, to the Service Provider have the power and authority to:
 - (i) enter upon and take possession and control of the Project Site / Project Facility forthwith;
 - (ii) prohibit the Service Provider and any person claiming through or under the Service Provider from entering upon/ dealing with the Project Site /Project Facility;

- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, SSU shall not, as a consequence of termination, have any obligation whatsoever

including but not limited to obligations as to compensation for loss of employment, continuance or regularization of employment, absorption or re-employment on any ground, in relation to any person in the employment of or engaged by the Service Provider in connection with the Project, and the hand back of the Project Facility by the Service Provider to USSP shall be free from any such obligation.

9.4 Accrued Rights of Parties

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Agreement, Termination pursuant to any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be without prejudice to accrued rights of either Party including its right to claim and recover money damages and other rights and remedies which it may have in law or contract. The rights and obligations of either Party under this Agreement, including without limitation those relating to the Termination Payment, shall survive the Termination but only to the extent such survival is necessary for giving effect to such rights and obligations.

Hand back Requirements

ARTICLE 10

10.1 Ownership

Without prejudice and subject to the agreement, the ownership of the Project Site, and the Project Facility, including all improvements made therein by the Service Provider, shall at all times remain that of SSU.

10.2 Obligations of Parties

(a) Service Provider's Obligations

The Service Provider shall on the date of expiry of the agreement Period, hand back peaceful possession of the Project Facility to SSU free of cost and in good operable condition.

- i. At least 12 months before the expected expiry of the Assignment Period a joint inspection of the Project Facility shall be undertaken by SSU and the Service Provider. SSU shall, within 45 days of such inspection prepare and furnish to the Service Provider a list of works/jobs ("Project Facility Hand back Requirements"), if any, to be carried out so as to conform to the VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PORGRAMME Requirements. The Service Provider shall promptly undertake and complete such works/jobs at least 3 months prior to the expected expiry of the Assignment Period and ensure that the Project Facility continues to meet such requirements until the same are handed back to SSU.
- ii. SSU shall, within 15 days of the joint inspection undertaken under preceding clause (i) prepare and furnish to the Service Provider a list of items, if any, with corresponding distinctive descriptions, which are to be

- iii. The Service Provider hereby acknowledges SSU's rights specified in Clause 9.3 enforceable against it upon Termination and its corresponding obligations arising there from. The Service Provider undertakes to comply with and discharge promptly all such obligations.

10.3 SSU's Obligations

SSU shall, subject to SSU's right to deduct amounts towards:

- (i) carrying out works/jobs listed under Clause 10.2(a)(ii), which have not been carried out by the Service Provider,
- (ii) purchase of items, which have not been handed back to SSU along with the Project Facility in terms of Clause 10.2(a)(iii), and
- (iii) any outstanding dues, which may have accrued in respect of the Project Facility during the Assignment Period. Duly discharge and release to the Service Provider the Performance Security within 3 months from the expiry of the Assignment Period.

Dispute Resolution

ARTICLE 11

11.1 Amicable Resolution

- (a) Save where expressly stated to the contrary in this Agreement, any dispute, difference or controversy of whatever nature between the Parties, howsoever arising under, out of or in relation to this Agreement (the "Dispute") shall in the first instance be attempted to be resolved amicably in accordance with the procedure set forth in sub-clause (b) below.
- (b) Either Party may require such Dispute to be referred to the Director, SSU and the Chief Executive Officer of the Service Provider for the time being, for amicable settlement. Upon such reference, the two shall meet at the earliest mutual convenience and in any event within 15 days of such reference to discuss and attempt to amicably resolve the Dispute. If the Dispute is not amicably settled within 15 days of such meeting between the two, either Party may refer the Dispute to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of Clause 11.2 below.

11.2 Arbitration

(a) Procedure

Subject to the provisions of Clause 11.1, any dispute, which is not resolved amicably, shall be finally settled by binding arbitration under the Arbitration Act. The arbitration shall be by one arbitrator, one to be appointed by each Party

and the third to be appointed by the two arbitrators appointed by the Parties. The Party requiring arbitration shall appoint an arbitrator in writing, inform the other Party about such appointment and call upon the other Party to appoint its arbitrator. If within 30 days of receipt of such intimation the other Party fails to appoint its arbitrator, the Party seeking appointment of arbitrator may take further steps in accordance with Arbitration Act.

(b) Place of Arbitration

The place of arbitration shall ordinarily be Dehradun but by agreement of the Parties, the arbitration hearings, if required, may be held elsewhere.

(c) English Language

The request for arbitration, the answer to the request, the terms of reference, any written submissions, any orders and awards shall be in English and, if oral hearings take place, English shall be the language to be used in the hearings.

(d) Enforcement of Award

The Parties agree that the decision or award resulting from arbitration shall be final and binding upon the Parties and shall be enforceable in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration Act subject to the rights of the aggrieved parties to secure relief from any higher forum.

(e) Performance during Arbitration

Pending the submission of and/or decision on a dispute and until the arbitration award is published; the Parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under this Agreement, without prejudice to a final adjustment in accordance with such award.

Representations and Warranties, Disclaimer

ARTICLE 12

12.1 Representations and Warranties of the Service Provider

The Service Provider represents and warrants to SSU that:

- (a) it is duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of India;
- (b) it has full power and authority to execute, deliver and perform its obligations under this Agreement and to carry out the transactions contemplated hereby;
- (c) it has taken all necessary corporate and other action under Applicable Laws and its constitutional documents to authorize the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement.

- (d) it has the financial standing and capacity to undertake the Project;
- (e) this Agreement constitutes its legal, valid and binding obligation enforceable against it in accordance with the terms hereof;
- (f) the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement will not conflict with, result in the breach of, constitute a default under or accelerate performance required by any of the terms of the Service Provider's Memorandum and Articles of Association or any Applicable Laws or any covenant, agreement, understanding, decree or order to which it is a party or by which it or any of its properties or assets are bound or affected;
- (g) there are no actions, suits, proceedings or investigations pending or to the Service Provider's knowledge threatened against it at law or in equity before any court or before any other judicial, quasi-judicial or other authority, the outcome of which may constitute Service Provider Event of Default or which individually or in the aggregate may result in Material Adverse Effect;
- (h) it has no knowledge of any violation or default with respect to any order, writ, injunction or any decree of any court or any legally binding order of any Government Agency which may result in Material Adverse Effect;
- (i) it has complied with all Applicable Laws and has not been subject to any fines, penalties, injunctive relief or any other civil or criminal liabilities which in the aggregate have or may have Material Adverse Effect;
- (j) subject to receipt by the Service Provider from USSP of any amount due under any of the provisions of this Agreement, in the manner and to the extent provided for under the applicable provisions of this Agreement all rights and interests of the Service Provider in and to the Project Site/Project Facility shall pass to and vest in USSP on the Termination Date free and clear of all Encumbrances without any further act or deed on the part of the Service Provider or USSP;
- (k) no representation or warranty by the Service Provider contained herein or in any other document furnished by it to SSU or to any Government Agency in relation to Applicable Permits contains or will contain any untrue statement of material fact or omits or will omit to state a material fact necessary to make such representation or warranty not misleading;
- (l) No bribe or illegal gratification has been paid or will be paid in cash or kind by or on behalf of the Service Provider to any person to procure the Assignment.
- (m) Without prejudice to any express provision contained in this Agreement, the Service Provider acknowledges that prior to the execution of this Agreement, the Service Provider has after a complete and careful examination made an independent evaluation of the Project Site, and the information provided by SSU, and has determined to its satisfaction the nature and extent of risks and hazards as are likely to arise or may be faced by the Service Provider in the course of performance of its obligations hereunder.

The Service Provider also acknowledges and hereby accepts the risk of inadequacy, mistake or error in or relating to any of the matters set forth above and hereby

confirms that SSU shall not be liable for the same in any manner whatsoever to the Service Provider.

12.2 Representations and Warranties of SSU

SSU represents and warrants to the Service Provider that:

- (a) SSU has full power and authority to grant the assignment;
- (b) SSU has taken all necessary action to authorize the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement;
- (c) This Agreement constitutes SSUs legal, valid and binding obligation enforceable against it in accordance with the terms hereof;
- (d) There are no suits or other legal proceedings pending or threatened against in respect of the Project, Project Site or Project Facility.

12.3 Obligation to Notify Change

In the event that any of the representations or warranties made/given by a Party ceases to be true or stands changed, the Party who had made such representation or given such warranty shall promptly notify the other of the same.

Miscellaneous

ARTICLE 13

13.1 Governing Law and Jurisdiction

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of India. The Courts at Dehradun shall have jurisdiction over all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement.

13.2 Waiver

- (a) Waiver by either Party of any default by the other Party in the observance and performance of any provision of or obligations under this Agreement:
 - (i) shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any other or subsequent default hereof or of other provisions or obligations under this Agreement;
 - (ii) shall not be effective unless it is in writing and executed by a duly authorized representative of such Party; and
 - (iii) shall not affect the validity or enforceability of this Agreement in any manner.
- (b) Neither the failure by either Party to insist on any occasion upon the performance of the terms, conditions and provisions of this Agreement or any obligation hereunder nor time or other indulgence granted by a Party to the

other Party shall be treated or deemed as waiver/breach of any terms, conditions or provisions of this Agreement.

13.3 Survival

Termination of this Agreement:

- (a) shall not relieve the Service Provider or SSU of any obligations already incurred hereunder which expressly or by implication survives Termination hereof, and
- (b) except as otherwise provided in any provision of this Agreement expressly limiting the liability of either Party, shall not relieve either Party of any obligations or liabilities for loss or damage to the other Party arising out of or caused by acts or omissions of such Party, prior to the effectiveness of such Termination or arising out of such Termination.

13.4 Amendments

This Agreement and the Schedules together constitute a complete and exclusive understanding of the terms of the Agreement between the Parties on the subject hereof and no amendment or modification hereto shall be valid and effective unless agreed to by both parties.

Provided failure to agree upon any such provisions shall not be subject to dispute resolution under this Agreement or otherwise.

13.7 No Partnership

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed or interpreted as constituting a partnership between the Parties. Neither Party shall have any authority to bind the other in any manner whatsoever.

13.8 Language

All notices required to be given under this Agreement and all communications, documentation and proceedings which are in any way relevant to this Agreement shall be in writing and in English language.

13.9 Exclusion of Implied Warranties etc.

This Agreement expressly excludes any warranty, condition or other undertaking implied at law or by custom or otherwise arising out of any other agreement between the Parties and any representation by any Party not contained in a binding legal agreement executed by the Parties.

13.10 Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in two counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall constitute an original of this Agreement but shall together constitute one and only the Agreement.

The Bank/Guarantor hereby irrevocably guarantees the due and punctual performance by M/s. _____ (hereinafter called "the Service Provider/Bidder") of all its obligations relating to the Project and in connection with achieving the project objectives by the Service Provider in accordance with the Service Agreement signed .
2.
